



The Ohio Justice Bus (“Bus”), and local volunteer lawyers will provide a free legal clinic for low-income senior residents of Medina County. We are happy to prepare any of the listed documents at no charge.

You will have an opportunity to talk with an attorney and a paralegal, and you will be able to sign the documents and take them home with you after the appointment. In preparation for this event, a questionnaire is provided for you to write down needed information, including the names and addresses of your children and any people who might be included in your will and/or other documents. **Please complete the questionnaire and bring it with you to your appointment. If this questionnaire is not complete, we will not be able to work with you.** You must **bring a picture ID** with you. You should expect that the appointment will be approximately two (2) hours.

Following is a brief description about the documents that we will prepare for you if you wish:

Last Will and Testament: The Will explains how you want your probate assets distributed after you die. If you die without a Will, your assets will be distributed according to state law. In your Will, you will name a person to carry out your directions for you. Even if you do not have any money or property to leave, a Will can make it easier on your children because it tells what you want to happen to your personal property, like furniture and other items in your home.

Living Will: The Living Will states your wishes about whether you want life-sustaining treatment withheld or withdrawn if you are unable to make informed medical decisions and are in a terminal condition or in a permanently unconscious state. A Living Will does not affect the responsibility of health care personnel to provide comfort to you to diminish your pain.

Health Care Power of Attorney: The Health Care Power of Attorney appoints someone you trust to make medical decisions for you if you are not able to make those decisions.

Financial (Durable) Power of Attorney: The Durable Power of Attorney appoints someone to take care of your financial affairs if you are unable to do it. This person can act on your behalf to manage your banking and business. Unlike the health care power of attorney, this document goes into effect immediately upon signing, unless there are special limitations placed on when it may go into effect.

Donor Registry Enrollment Form: This document gives your consent to use your organs and/or tissues for someone else at the time of your death.

Declaration of Funeral Arrangements: This document identifies your wishes for the disposition of your remains, including but not limited to funeral arrangements, burial, or cremation.

***Transfer on Death Deed (Property):** If you own a home/land, this allows you to designate who will get the property after you pass, without the need to go through probate court for that specific property.

***Transfer Beneficiary Affidavit for Vehicle:** Allows you to designate who will receive your vehicle(s) after you pass, removing the need to probate the vehicle(s).
